NBDPN Grant Funding

NBDPN received funding from CDC for Year 2 of the Cooperative Agreement "Enhancing partnerships to address birth defects, infant disorders and related conditions, and the health of pregnant and postpartum people," which began September 30th. The first project year focused on hiring and planning, staff, strategic and performance measures. During Year 2, NBDPN will continue to work on activities and objectives established in Year 1, with additional funding to support the 2025 NBDPN National Conference. Funded activities include data collection. dissemination of data-informed products, building capacity and technical assistance, and partnerships.
